PLAYWRIGHT



While researching small-town Minnesota history for a previous show, I developed a fascination with the so-called "journalism" of the late 1800s. Its showy prose, whimsical turns of phrase and penchant for wild hyperbole and half-truth (the latter increasingly parallel to our current media landscape) felt like fertile linguistic ground for a future project, and upon discovering the sensationalist tale of Nellie King, I was sure I'd discovered the engine that could drive a musical. What I didn't expect was the many ways Nellie's story intersected with concerns of the present, or the powerful, poignant reckoning that emerged with deeper research.

Whoa, Nellie! is about many things, but firstly this: a charismatic and complicated person in pursuit of fame as a means of achieving love, acceptance and transcendent immortality. Nellie entered the public sphere at a pivotal moment in American history, where vaudeville and newspapers' popularity expanded to create the country's first mass culture, and with it the modern notion of celebrity. It's a role Nellie was only too happy to inhabit (she carried her news clippings with her and would proudly share them with officers during her many arrests) as she willingly embraced the larger-than-life persona of a "wily and scandalous female cowboy detective."

Underneath that showy veneer, though, a more complex human story emerges - one that raises potent questions around an array of issues that resonate in the present tense (addiction, mental health, gender identity and gender inequity, to name just a few). Nellie's story is largely forgotten, but in this theatrical resurrection her spirit returns to ask us for absolution, or at least understanding, as her misadventures are considered through the lens of historical hindsight and proper social context. As she puts it in the play, "I think these folks might just catch up with my particular brand of nonconformity." Here's hoping you do, with a lot of laughter, toe-tapping joy and maybe a stray tear along the way.

My deepest gratitude goes out to History Theatre for continuing to champion new work like $Who\alpha$, Nellie!, supporting art that lives equally in the past and the present - posing questions, touching souls and pushing all of us to move through the world with a fuller, better sense of the ground on which we stand.

Whoa, Nellie! introduces five celebrities of Nellie King's era to help re-enact her story. Though far more famous than Nellie (in their day as in ours), each of these historical figures echoes her life in certain aspects of their life, work, or struggles.

ANNIE OAKLEY (1860-1926)

Annie Oakley was a sharpshooter who rose to fame as a headliner in the popular touring attraction Buffalo Bill's Wild West. Her acts included shooting playing cards and even dimes out of the air, and she performed record-breaking feats of marksmanship throughout her life. She also advocated for women's knowledge of firearms as a form of self-defense.



NELLIE BLY (1864–1922)

Nellie Bly was a reporter whose influential work helped establish the tradition of investigative journalism. She is known for traveling around the world in a record-setting 76 days, and for exposés in which she spent time undercover as a factory worker and a lunatic asylum inmate in order to report on the inhumane conditions in those settings.

GENDER DIVERSITY IS OLD NEWS.

I mean that for as long as there have been women and men, there have been those who live between, across, or beyond those categories. Testimony of their lives comes to us from cultures around the world and throughout history.

I mean "old news" in a literal sense, too: the pages of 19th-century U.S. newspapers abound with sensational accounts of gender nonconforming individuals. In many cases, our sole knowledge of their stories comes to us in the form of journalistic coverage. (This is often supplemented by arrest records - ordinances against appearing in clothing of the "opposite" sex were commonplace well into the late 20th century.)

Sifting through the biases and ambiguities of the available evidence, we find a diverse cast of gender-bending characters. Certain figures lived their lives in accordance with a deeply felt inner sense of identity. Others temporarily disguised themselves across gender lines as means to an end - safety, employment, entertainment. Some stepped outside the







BERT WILLIAMS (1874–1922)

Bert Williams was one of the most famous American entertainers of his era, a celebrated comedian who produced shows and played roles that challenged stereotypes and broke racial barriers for Black entertainers in vaudeville, musical theatre, and early film. Williams was particularly known for a woeful, down-on-his-luck stage persona, exemplified in his hit song "Nobody."

AIDA OVERTON WALKER (1880-1914)

Aida Overton Walker was a vaudeville and theatre performer known for solo acts as well for performing alongside her husband. George Walker, and Bert Williams in shows such as In Dahomeu, the earliest musical written and performed by Black artists to play at a major Broadway theatre. After George's death, she performed parts of his acts and garnered acclaim for her portrayals of male characters.

JULIAN ELTINGE (1881–1941)

Julian Eltinge was a female impersonator who achieved great fame in vaudeville, theatre, and silent film. His career spanned the rise and decline of female impersonation as a popular, generally respected vaudeville genre; beginning in the 1920s it moved into nightclubs and attracted increasing scrutiny and repression. Offstage, Eltinge presented as a straight, masculine man and took a combative stance toward rumors about his sexuality.

bounds of prescribed gender for ambiguous or multiple reasons.

So it is with Nellie King, whose press coverage (and carceral record) point to a defiantly freespirited individual who certainly leveraged male presentation for practical purposes, but who seems to have taken a certain amount of glee in it, too. To the reporters of the day, she was "notorious," a "wily adventuress,"

"cowboy queen and girl detective," which is to say, "a young lady of uncertain social standing and masculine propensities." To those of us seeking, and finding, our gender-expansive forebears in the historical record, she's a singularly fierce and lawless ancestor among the uncountable many who came before us, one who flouted the norms of her time in parks, parlors, and prison cells, on stages, street corners, and

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stolen horses. And who, in her own words, "made a dandy-looking boy-man, too."

In our era of rising vitriol, when federal policies and executive orders explicitly cast us as representatives of a dangerous new ideology, it's nice to be reminded that we are, in fact, old news.



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
