

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

FROM THE PLAYWRIGHT

I got a call from Ron in the early part of 2019. I remember because I was just about to leave town to fly to Jamaica to co-lead a workshop at the University of the West Indies in Kingston. He wanted to talk about the book *Diesel Heart* by Melvin Carter Jr., which he'd just read. He said, I think you know Melvin and Toni. I said, I do. I said, we've been friends for a long time. I'm also friends with Anika, Melvin III, and Alanna, their children. And I know their grandchildren from doing summer arts camps and directing them in plays at Steppingstone Theater. So, we go wa-ay back.

Ron gave me his copy of the book, which I took with me to Jamaica. After the workshop and meetings in Kingston, I knew I'd have time to sit on a beach and decompress. And that's where I planned to read Melvin's book.

I am sure some of the people on the beach thought I'd lost my mind, or that I'd ingested some of the local product because I kept laughing out loud and talking back to the book. I'd walk along the beach and talk back to the characters in the book. I'd empathize with his parents and wonder over and over, how is Melvin still alive? And if you ask Melvin, he will tell you, it was "grace."

After I got back in town, Ron set up a meeting in his office. It was Ron, Melvin, Laurie Flanigan Hegge, and me. Melvin showed up and started telling stories. This made Laurie laugh out loud and for a very long time. That "inspired" Melvin to tell more stories. And that just made Laurie lose her mind and laugh even more. Deep belly laughs. Turning sideways, laughing. We all agreed there was a play that needed to be written.

Melvin and I started to meet regularly. We'd sit at the table in his house. We meet at coffee shops in town. Or he'd take me for a drive in his car around the city and talk about what St. Paul was like back in the day. He would tell me stories that didn't make it into the book. He would talk reverentially about his parents, and his family, and the community that is/was Rondo.

And I tried to listen. I tried to pay attention. I tried to include all of what I learned and find a place for those thoughts and people in this play, *Diesel Heart*. I hope you like what I've done. I also hope it will inspire you to want to get and read the book. I highly recommend reading it on a beach in Jamaica. Just kidding. Read it when and wherever you can. You won't regret it.

FROM THE DIRECTOR

Director, playwright, artistic director program notes often start by telling you what drew them to the story. I came to this project in the middle of the process of development. Decisions had been made and I had to catch up, keep up. One reading of the book, *Diesel Heart*, let me know that I was being welcomed in to the telling of a wonderful story. I admonished the actors to, "Read the book. Read the book! Read the Book!!" I encourage you, the audience, to do the same when you leave the theater.

Know, however, that even reading the book does not tell the whole story. In the rehearsal room Seitu Jones and Rick Thompson shared stories of their experiences with the Carter family and the Rondo neighborhood. Brian Grandison shared stories drawn from countless hours spent with Melvin and other people we meet in the play. Then there is Melvin, himself, who came into the room and not only told us stories, but laid bare his fears and weaknesses. Melvin, who has said he felt at one time, "so insignificant, unworthy of even a fundamental simple courtesy. Okay, God! My soul screamed. I face the towering treetops and shouted, 'I just wanna know if I'm going to make it, or not!... just give me some kind of sign! Am I gonna survive this?'" A strong wind blew, and from the treetops Melvin received his message from God.

Read the book. But first enjoy our production.

Thank you Melvin, Rick, Brian, and Ron Peluso for inviting me onboard.



Ever since the 1974 murders of his cousins Henry and Gregory, Melvin Carter Jr.'s life mission has been to prevent other families from getting "that phone call" in the middle of the night. To that end, in the early 1990s he created

SAVE OUR SONS with other men in our community. They started by offering a Saturday Academy and made regular night raid intercessions into the homes of young men at the request of frightened single mothers. Through these and other SOS programs hundreds of east metro young men have been mentored into leaving gang life and becoming proud productive members of the community.

Melvin Carter Jr., now a retired Sargent from the St. Paul Police Department, continues the work of SAVE OUR SONS. He does that with weekly visits to the Ramsey County Juvenile Detention Center (JDC), where over the years he has visited with over 2500 young men who most need de-escalation coaching. Particularly at the JDC, Melvin Carter Jr. has developed a particular communication wave link with the most troubled, vulnerable amongst us, the ones most likely to become victims or the victimizers. He also makes regular



other community locations where he meets with and mentors at-risk young men and women. We believe that his contacts have had a direct effect of reducing crime in the east metro area.

With students at Gordon Parks High School, Melvin is developing the SOS GUN SANITY project with written materials, a gun violence avoidance video for parents, elders, clergy, and ultimately schools, tools to provide youth with avoidance and de-escalation skills. Over the past 20 years, he has already prepared and produced booklets and videos on violence avoidance. In our next stage of work SOS is focused on developing, and producing stronger, higher quality materials, humanizing victims, families, especially highlighting the painful price, the regrets of having taken a human life.

Melvin Carter's storytelling is rooted in challenging gun glorification language, presumptions and conclusions. His leadership skill is the power of reaching the unreachable and teaching the unteachable, through the power of story and storyteller.

## On Stage: Creating a Community Dialogue Around Live Theater



History Theatre is thrilled to be partnering with On Stage: Creating a Community Dialogue Around Live Theater. On Stage, a fiscallysponsored program through Springboard for the Arts, brings actors and teaching artists to college classrooms around the Twin Cities. Local actors and students read scenes from a play in current local production followed by a lively discussion of the themes tying in current events, personal values and narratives, and stimulating critical thinking. Subsequently attending the full play is encouraged.

Since On Stage was launched in the fall of 2016, they have partnered with 12 theater companies in the Twin Cities, covering 26 plays. Over 6500 students have been introduced to new theater and new theater venues through the plays that On Stage has promoted and discussed in classrooms, and more than 29 percent of these students paid to

see the performance that we're promoted and discussed. On Stage continues to focus on partnering with small/mid-sized theaters that don't have the resources for their own outreach efforts.

Over the course of two weeks in March, On Stage teaching artists will facilitate in-class discussions about "Mlima's Tale" with over 400+students in 18 classes at University of Minnesota, Augsburg University, Macalester College, University of St. Thomas, St. Catherine University, MCTC, Century College, Hennepin Technical College, Normandale Community College, and Inver Hills Community College.





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
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
