





FROM THE PLAYWRIGHT

Jesse James isn't the first robber and murderer to become a pop culture phenomenon. The earliest version is probably Macheath in John Gay's "The Beggar's Opera", written in 1728, based on the real life highwayman Jonathan Wild. So, by the time Jesse James and his gang became part of America's consciousness in the 1860s, there was already a template for fictionalizing and romanticizing true crime tales in story and song, a template that would be used over and over for Billy the Kid, John Dillinger, Pretty Boy Floyd, Bonnie and Clyde, Charles Starkweather and Caril Ann Fugate. America has always had a fondness for desperados, but we have a tendency to clean them up and make their crimes palatable, sometimes even noble. That's why we often prefer the fictionalized versions to the real thing: Warren Beatty and Faye Dunaway, Marlon Brando, Jerry Lee Lewis, Elvis and Johnny Depp (we love them until we don't).

Previous eras saw Jesse James as a doomed hero, the kind of sympathetic outlaw played by actors like Tyrone Power, Robert Wagner and Brad Pitt. Today, it's tempting to dismiss him as irredeemable, deplorable. Jesse James is what is now called a problematic character, inseparable from the politics and culture of his time: slavery, the Civil War, the brutality of the border state militias, and the Lost Cause. But the theater is filled with problematic characters, often based on real people: Oedipus, Richard III, Hedda Gabbler, Willy Loman, Mama Rose, Troy Maxson, and Roy Cohn. To write about history is to wrestle both with the past and with our own incomplete grasp of it. What we can say with certainty is that whatever Jesse James was, everything changed when he and his gang rode into Northfield, Minnesota on September 7, 1876 – which is why our show is called "the defeat of Jesse James."

A

s playwrights well know, a dastardly villain can make for compelling drama and enduring appeal. Minnesota has known its share of

villainous individuals, from the incidental to the iconic: Titanic cardsharp George Brereton was born in Madelia; George "Bugs" Moran, Al Capone's chief rival, was raised in St. Paul; John Dillinger slept here; Bonnie and Clyde may have robbed banks here; and would-be 9/11 terrorist Zacarias Moussaoui took flight lessons here. There is one character, though, who has stood front and center on Minnesota's stage, perhaps like no other: Jesse Woodson James.

Jesse, of course, was the leader of the eight-man James-Younger gang that attempted to rob Northfield's First National Bank on September 7, 1876. "From its opening to its closing shot,"

wrote Professor George Huntington in his estimable account of the raid, "it had occupied but seven minutes."

As the townsfolk rallied to safeguard the bank's employees and protect its monetary assets, the outlaws were forced to exit stage left in a decidedly ignominious manner, Jesse included. The raid was brief but the ensuing discussion and disputation down through the years have been anything but.

Nearly six years after the attempted robbery, Jesse James was assassinated by fellow gang member (though not a Northfield raider) Robert Ford. In the decades that followed, stories occasionally appeared in print that questioned whether James had indeed been killed. In about 1933 a certain J. Frank Dalton, a man who claimed to have

"soldiered" with Jesse as a Civil
War raider, responded to just
such a story in the Denver
Post. Like James, Dalton
would later become the
unlikeliest of Northfield

protagonists.

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


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
